COUNCIL ELECTION UPDATE

The 2016 City Council Election will be held this year on Saturday, May 7, 2016.

The filing period for those wishing to run for office begins January 20 and ends February 19 at 5:00 p.m. Candidates must be: 1) at least 21 years of age; 2) a qualified voter; 3) a resident in the Sachse city limits for six months prior to the filing deadline; 4) current in payment of taxes due the City; and 5) applying for only one place on the ballot.

The following Places are up for re-election: Place five (5), Incumbent Cullen King, Place six (6), Incumbent Jeff Bickerstaff, and Mayor, Incumbent Mike Felix.

WINTER WEATHER

At the first mention of a winter freeze, traffic and commerce in North Central Texas freezes too. Why? While colder weather brings a welcome change, most people aren't prepared for it. Freezing rain, snow and ice can make for great outdoor fun but can also result in car accidents, hypothermia, and carbon monoxide poisoning from defective heating units. In addition, a few inches of ice can bring down power lines that result in days-long outages. And on the road, that quick trip to grandma's can turn into an impromptu camp-out in the car. But don't get your mittens in a twist. With a little planning, you can protect yourself and enjoy some frosty fun!

Winter Weather Safety Tips:

- Wear several layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing instead of one heavy layer of clothing. Make sure that outer garments are water-repellent.
- Ensure that your heating source is working properly and well ventilated. Have it serviced regularly.
- Avoid driving on overpasses and bridges; they often freeze more quickly than roads.
- Winterize your car. Flush the cooling system, replace the coolant, replace the wiper blades, etc. Create a Winter Weather Kit in case you're stranded.
- Winterize your pipes. Keep faucets dripping when the temperature drops below freezing.
- Take extra precautions to ensure the well-being of your animals by providing plenty of water, food, as well as appropriate shelter.

Residential Sewer Averaging

Conserving water now will save you money year round! Sewer Averaging calculation is underway. The months of November through March will be used as the basis for calculating a residential customer's average monthly usage. The highest and lowest use months of the five winter months will be deleted from the calculation, and the three remaining months averaged to determine the monthly volume. For example, if a resident uses an average of 9,000 gallons per month, their residential sewer rate per month will be \$10.41 plus (\$5.79 x 9) for a rate of \$62.52. This calculated volume shall apply for the next 12 months. Be sure to contact Utility Billing if you find and repair a leak on your property during this time.
