Mayor and City Council Unopposed - Remember to VOTE May 11 for Street Maintenance Sales Tax and Charter Amendments

Mayor Mike Felix was unopposed during this election and will start his fourth term as Sachse's mayor. Place 5 candidate Cullen King and Place 6 candidate Jeff Bickerstaff were also unopposed in this election. They will be sworn in to begin their service at the June 3 Council meeting, at which time we will recognize outgoing Councilman Mark Timm and Councilwoman Pat McMillan who both served three terms on Council.

It is important that citizens remember to vote as there are two issues on the ballot that need consideration. The street maintenance sales tax, which will set aside 1/4 of one cent for street maintenance and repairs of city streets and alleys, and 27 proposed amendments to the City Charter.

Early voting starts April 29 thru May 4, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm; May 5, 1:00 to 6:00 pm; and May 6 and 7, 7:00 am to 7:00 pm. Polls are open on May 11 from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm. STAGE 2 WATERING PLAN STILL IN PLACE

Sachse remains in Stage 2 water restrictions. Residents may water twice a week on designated days. If the last digit of your address is an odd number, water Saturdays and Wednesdays; if the last digit of your address is an even number, water Sundays and Thursdays. Watering is still allowed ONLY before 10 am and/or after 6 pm. Watering between 10 am and 6 pm and watering on a day other than your designated day is prohibited. SACHSE TEAMING UP WITH DALLAS COUNTY FOR MOSQUITO SEASON

Sachse and Dallas County Health and Human Services (DCHHS) are already planning strategy for attacking the mosquito season. DCHHS has set up four mosquito traps in multiple fixed areas in both counties of Sachse. The traps are monitored weekly. If a mosquito is found positive for West Nile Virus (WNV), DCHHS responds by ground spraying the area where the mosquito was found. City staff will notify citizens in advance of spraying. We will also attack any mosquito problem at its source, treating standing water with a larvicide that is environmentally safe. Resident's requests to investigate an area of concern are welcome. LOW COST SHOT CLINIC



With the increase of rabid animals recently in our area, it is important that you get your pet vaccinated. Animal Control is hosting a Pet Shot Clinic on Saturday, May 11 at the Animal Shelter, 6436 Sachse Road, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. **DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AND CATS MUST BE IN CARRIERS.** Animal Allies will be on hand offering dog and cat shot packages, puppy and kitten shot packages, heartworm tests, feline leukemia vaccine and tests, and microchips. By City Ordinance, pets must be registered and tags worn showing proof of registration and vaccination. City tags are \$2.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered; \$7.00 if they are not. Please bring proof of spay/neuter. Bring a can of dog food and receive your city registration FREE. Check the website for cost of services offered. No checks or debit/credit cards can be accepted.
